Effective September 2, open carry firearm implemented

Considered scary by many

Will not impact schools, churches or higher education -

organizations/properties already prohibiting firearms on premises.

Guns will not be allowed in these locations

In all other businesses, signage must be posted stating Firearms are allowed

not

If someone is carrying a firearm where it is posted, they may be asked to leave and if they do not then police may be called to enforce issue of trespassing

Ordinance prohibiting discharge of a firearm in the city limits will continue to remain intact

No problems yet this year

President T. Ourada-Hubka requested that a meeting to be set up in January for North East district neighborhoods, hosted by ECCO.

Would like to invite the police chief to introduce themselves at that time and to answer questions
