
ECCO to Host 4th of July Parade on Saturday the 3rd!



Apple Street Parking update



We need your continued input for Yard of the Month:

Cindy Loope nominated Todd Hollenbeck's yard at 802 N. 33rd St. for the June Yard of the Month.

After a meeting with neighbors and city officials in January, the ECCO board began working with residents of Apple St. to reduce the parking problems and improve visibility and safety. A letter explaining the situation and the board proposal was sent to residents whose property fronted Apple St. between 37th and 40th St. We were pleased with the number of responses to the letter, which gave us feedback on the best approach to take to improve the situation. Two board members approached the homeowners on the north side of the street with a petition to restrict parking between 8:00 and 4:00, Monday through Friday. More than 80% of the homeowners approached signed the petition. The petition was submitted to the city on June 9th. It will take about 3 to 4 weeks for the city to process the request (make sure we have enough homeowner signatures) and if there are no problems they will send it on to the department who will install the signs, which could take another four to six weeks. They should be installed before the new school year begins. Our thanks to Apple St. residents, Dennis Diestler, Vera Mae Lutz, and Dean Phelps for helping us with this issue.
