President's Letter

It has been a busy year for ECCO! We accomplished a lot. There were several **zoning actions** that presented **both threats and opportunities** for ECCO, including the following:

Parking—A proposed change in the zoning code that would reduce the requirements for off-street parking for sororities and fraternities was opposed by ECCO, and only ECCO. Working closely with the Lincoln-Lancaster Planning Department, we were able develop new wording that made more sense and actually increased the parking requirements. As a result we were able to testify in support of the change in the zoning code before the Planning Commission and City Council. We also initiated an on-going discussion with the University about the continuing parking problems in the neighborhood.

Holdrege/Idylwild/Valentino's Block —ECCO contacted WRK, the developers of the Holdrege-Valentino's Block long before the project went

public. WRK and Valentino's responded promptly and came to our Board meeting with the general outlines of their proposal long before the final plans were completed. Working with WRK while the plans were still in development allowed ECCO to make suggestions to make the project acceptable to the neighborhood as a whole and to the immediate neighbors. Most of our suggestions were adopted by the developer. We also held two public meetings, each attended by more than sixty people, to discuss the project and get further input from the neighbors. At the end of the last meeting the strong consensus of the group was that ECCO should support the project. ECCO proceeded to testify in support of the project at all public hearings before the Planning Commission and City Council.

City Impact Project—ECCO supported the City Impact project that is being built just across 33rd Street next to Peter Pan Park.

ECCO sponsored several neighborhood events

Neighborhood Clean-up – This year the neighborhood clean-up was held in connection with UNL's student volunteer day, the "Big Event." Students from AGR fraternity helped out a great deal. In spite of the cold weather, we collected a lot of trash and, as always, people expressed a lot of appreciation for the service.

Discover ECCO - ECCO sponsored a neighborhood "art/hobby" fair with 18 exhibitors, a "house detective", story corps, ECCO history conversations, a "bustaraunt" and a polka band. An estimated 250 people attended the event. A large article with great pictures in the Lincoln Journal Star provided a lot of good PR for ECCO. During the event I heard people saying, wow, it's been a long time since I have talked with you and I am glad we met. Many urged ECCO to have another *Discover ECCO* event next year.

Northeast Lincoln Partnership — ECCO has begun to establish relationships with other Northeast Lincoln neighborhood associations, including Havelock, University Place and Clinton.

July 4th Parade —A good time was had at the annual July 4th Parade. A highlight of the event was naming Marceil Dreier as the Parade Marshall, in honor of all her service to the neighborhood over the years. I think Marceil was pretty surprised.

Other Activities

- ECCO sponsored an **Opinion Survey** of Neighborhood Homeowners conducted by students of Nebraska Wesleyan University.
- Five board members attended a series of neighborhood leadership workshops, Building Leaders/Building Communities sponsored by NeighborWorks. As a result we got a lot of good ideas and will receive a grant for \$2500 \$3000 to be used for a neighborhood project.
- I did a half-hour interview about ECCO on community radio station KZUM.
- We submitted a grant application to *Trees for Nebraska* to plant trees in the neighborhood.
- ECCO helped support the neighborhood East Campus Starr's **Easter Egg Hunt**.
- We honored four homes with our *Yard of the Month* sign. (If it hadn't been stolen, there would've been more.)

We are looking forward to the ECCO Annual Meeting on Tuesday October 30th. The primary focus of the Annual Meeting is to set the agenda for ECCO for next year.
