During the tour, Master Gardeners will hold mini—class sessions on *Tree Care*, *Making Amazing Container Gardens*, *Perennial Selections for Your Yard* and *Composting for a Healthy Garden*. There will also be a representative from the City of Lincoln's Watershed Management division on the tour at the site of one of the rain gardens to provide information on water quality and best management practices.
