Invite your friends and join East Campus neighbors for the **2019 ECCO Garden Tour** on Saturday, June 15 from 9 am to 1 pm. Visit some of the beautiful gardens in our East Campus neighborhood. Proceeds from the \$5 event fee will benefit the ongoing ECCO Re-treeing Project to replace neighborhood street trees.

Tips and literature about rain gardens, rain barrels, lawn & landscape care and other water quality topics will be available at a rain garden included in the tour.

Mini-classes will be held at different tour sites through the day.

Neighborhood Master Gardeners and an educator from the City of Lincoln Watershed will conduct mini-classes on the following topics:

- Pots and Container Gardens
- Perennials for the Garden
- Soils and Fertilizers for Tropicals and Succulents
- Bees in the Garden
- Fun with Rain Barrels

Watch for signs for locations. You can start the tour at any neighborhood garden host location. Tour maps and mini-class schedules will be available at each site. ■

ECCO's Fourth of July Parade is coming!

Join your neighbors and friends at the annual **ECCO 4th of July Parade** event on **Thursday, July 4**. Come walk in the parade or support the marchers, which will include a Lincoln Fire Department truck, along the route. Following the parade, stay at the park for games, treats, and more fun.

The parade starts at **Valentino's-Idylwild Park**. Line up at the park at 9:45 am; the parade will start at 10 am. The route will start headed east on Apple St. to 38th St., north to Dudley, east to 40th St., south to Orchard and back to Idylwild Park.

Kids and adults are welcome to bring their bikes, wagons, shoes or any other means of transportation. Get out your patriotic colors and dress up your

“vehicle” or yourself. Bring musical instruments or join our “Rock Band” – decorate empty milk jugs with rocks in them to shake while marching. Prizes contributed by area businesses will be awarded for these categories: Best Entry of the Parade, Best Bicycle, Best Tricycle, Best Costume, and Best Pet.

If you do not want to walk in the parade, join us as a parade watcher. No parade is complete without people along the route cheering the participants along. You too are invited to dress for the occasion.

You and your neighbors enjoy the colorful display of fireworks through the holiday. Allow everyone to enjoy it even more by cleaning up your fireworks waste. Leftover debris makes your neighborhood look bad. Runoff chemicals and debris are pollutants that flow directly to area streams. Clean up is easy – have a broom & bucket of water handy. Let your spent fireworks cool a few minutes, toss them in the water bucket and, at the end of the night, sweep up the debris and put it in the trash.

Remember that warm weather can turn an open garage into an inviting target. Be sure to put away bicycles. Lock your home and cars. Communicate with your neighbors, watch each other’s homes for suspicious persons or activities, and don’t hesitate to call the police if you see something unusual.
