### Happy July 4th From Neighborhood Watch Newsletter | The Eye May 2024 Volume 45

Celebrations during the 4th of July are a common sight during the early part of July. Please keep in mind that Lincoln has different rules than that of the surrounding counties, including Lancaster County.

The ordinance is as follows: "It shall be unlawful for any person to discharge, explode, or use any permissible fireworks within the City of Lincoln except from 8:00am to 11:00pm on July 3 and from 8:00am to 11:59 pm on July 4 of each year. (Ord. 18608 §2; August 29, 2005: prior Ord. 17516 § 1; June 14, 1999: Ord."

Come visit the ECCO table at the 2025 East Campus Discovery Days and Farmers Market on second Saturdays this summer. The events on July 12th and August 9th from 10:00am to 1:00pm will be held on the East Campus Mall, north of Idylwild and Holdrege Streets.

Community members are expected to be considerate of others concerns as well while celebrating.

- 1. Fireworks may not be sold or purchased in the city limits except on July 3rd and 4th.
- 2. Fireworks may not be used in the City of Lincoln unless on July 3rd or 4th. There are specific hours in which they can be used. (See the ordinance above)
- 3. In Lincoln, bottle rockets, helicopter-type fireworks (where the entire item leaves the ground), and sky

lanterns are prohibited. At no time may these fireworks be used within the city limits.

4. Fireworks used in any other way than they are intended (to be shot into the sky or displayed on the ground) are prohibited. Any firework that is modified can be considered an improvised explosive. We want people to have fun during their

celebrations, but we also want them to be safe! •
